

Board of Selectmen Meeting

August 3, 2010

Town Hall

Present: Chairman Duncan Ross, Selectmen Gail Barmakian, Kathleen Burton, Gregory Coogan, Ronald DiOrio. Also present: Attorney Ronald Rappaport, Town Administrator Michael Dutton, Administrator Alice Ryan Butler.

Meeting called to order at 1:00 p.m.

Selectman Coogan motioned to refer the Ocean Club to the Martha's Vineyard Commission, seconded by Selectman Barmakian. Vote was unanimous.

The Massachusetts Black Lawyers Club has requested a one day beer and wine license. The event will take place on August 14, 2010 from 5:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. There will be approximately fifty people in a tent with a catered meal.

Selectman DiOrio motioned to approve the one day beer and wine license, seconded by Selectman Coogan. Vote was four in favor. Selectman Barmakian abstained.

The new "bumper cars" being made available by Jason Leone were discussed. They are not currently registered and therefore not available for rent. He will be on the Agenda for the August 24, 2010 meeting.

The Summer Residents Reception, August 10, 2010 will be advertised.

Putting sand on Inkwell Beach may be delayed.

The negotiations with the MVRHS teachers has concluded. The wage increases will be 0%, 2% and 2.75%. There will be no Master Medical.

Selectman Barmakian and Local Inspector James Dunn conducted a "walk about" at the Harbor to identify signs and "sandwich boards" located on town property. The by-law that prohibits them will be enforced.
