

# SEAVIEW WATERFRONT PROJECT

## SCOPE OF PROJECT

Starting on the South at the end of the seawall at Farm Pond and continuing North to the jetty which forms the channel to the harbor, the following items are considered to be vital parts of the project:

Seawall, Farm Pond dredging, Farm Pond/Seaview Avenue bike path interface, bike and pedestrian travel along Sea View (in particular the trouble spots at curve by Farm Pond and bordering Ocean Park), bike accommodations along Seaview, sidewalks, benches, telephone poles, pet waste/trash/recycleables containers, signage, street lighting, railing system, cross walks, access points to beaches, universal access points to beaches, universal access across beaches to the water, lifeguards and lifeguard stations, comfort facilities (locations?), showers, concessions, sand, beach nourishment, offshore mining, beach grooming, jetties, road runoff treatment and discharge options, Waban Park (runoff treatment possibilities), parking along Seaview, Steamship Authority staging area (leased from the town), Civil War Monument park (possible retention facility for road run-off), bluff restoration, plantings on bluffs, removal of asphalt bluff, bus stop shelters, viewing stand at Pay Beach area, walkway/universal access path along old rail tracks (south of the SSA and north of "Pay Beach"), bathrooms at the North Bluff, fishing pier at the North Bluff, universal access to both, walkway along the sea wall below the North Bluff, beach renourishment at "Jetty Beach", restoration of "Oak Bluffs" gardens on North Bluff.

The structural work at and on the seawalls, beaches and bluffs will provide protection for the entire bluff system under the Seaview Avenue roadway and sidewalks, the roadways and sidewalks themselves, the wastewater effluent beds under Ocean Park, and all structures and coastal systems on the entire waterfront.

The southern jetty which forms the channel to the harbor marks the northern boundary of this project, as the channel and jetties are under the purview of the Harbor Management Committee.
