Minutes of 08.26.10 / 06.30.10 meeting read & approved (Agenda Item #1)

Superintendent's Report (Agenda Item #4)

It was a good opening day for students and staff of the MV Public Schools (MVPS)—\$48 million budget, 500 personnel and 625,000 sq. ft. of facilities. The Island educational community had been extremely lucky in avoiding the deep financial and staff cuts suffered all over the country including Cape Cod and Nantucket.

Policy (Agenda Item #5)
School Lunch

As noted at the last meeting the lunch payment policy was being changed to trigger student family notification at \$5 and delinquent notification at \$10.

Retirement

The Oak Bluffs School Committee (OBSC) argued a request for a revised letter of retirement from former Principal Laury Binney. The issues were, sick day buy back, language, back dating and Mass. Teachers Retirement Board regulations.

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Financial Report (Agenda Item #3)

School Lunch Fund (See documents on file.)

At the beginning of the year the program looked good and revenue was satisfactory (see below: Policy).

Expenditure Report (See documents on file.)

Still early in the year there were no journal transfers. School Choice funds dedicated to the Fiscal Year 2011 (FY11) budget would be taken out of the Administrative Salaries line.

- There was a projected deficit in the Special Education (SpEd) summer school line as well as another in the longevity line – due to the new teachers contract.
- The OBSC requested:
 - a list of OBS new hires,
 - a comparative salary list for FY10 and FY11,
 - the previous documentation for the School Choice withdrawals.

FY10 Closeout

The Town 's new bookkeeper was making progress in closing out FY10. The Residential Placement debt had been discussed with Town Administrator Michael Dutton.

School Choice Fund (See documents on file.)

The invoice inconsistency with Vineyard Bottled water was resolved. The custodians were now trained to clean all ventilation units except the Gym.

Scholarship Fund

Every year at 8th grade graduation the OBS granted \$500 to a child to be redeemed at their graduation from high school. These scholarships were tracked for each student in a special fund. There was a question of whether the scholarship language included graduation from any high school or if it specified the MV Regional High School (MVRHS).

Principal's Report (Agenda Item #6)

Enrollment 403 – English Language Learners (ELL) 28.

Maintenance & Facility Issues:

Posts – There was no response to repeated calls to the Town Highway, Parks and Recreation Department. If possible the Administration would do the work themselves.

Windows repair was proceeding; the staff and custodians were asked to check for any additional breaks.

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MCAS

MCAS scores were received and will be mailed home this week. English/Language Arts (E/LA) met its target. Title One grant, tutoring and reading teacher consultation would all be implemented this year. The MV Public Schools were behind in student achievement measurement / analysis.

Busses

Delays in buses and parking/traffic chaos during morning and afternoon drop-off and pick-up continued to be a problem. No solutions had been found to traffic patterns, keeping parents in their cars, other exits, etc. Brian Scott was commended for his work as a crossing guard.

PA System – was still not functioning properly. Other schools had been surveyed and Simplex would be asked to come to the Vineyard for repairs as this was a safety/security matter. In addition Prin. Hart requested the purchase of two-way radios.

BTSN - (Back To School Night) was well attended. Follow up would include a brochure on curriculums and a short survey on what parents really wanted to know.

- 500 people at the OBS (400 students and 100 staff) were using 175 outdated computers (including the popular mobile lab). The Administration was looking for funding to update school technology hardware.

- There were 22 paraprofessionals in the OBS.
